**TELECOM ITALIA: DEFINITION OF TERMS  
FOR 3.5 \$ BILLION BOND ISSUE**

*Milan, 28 September 2004* - Telecom Italia announces that Telecom Italia Capital S.A. today completed the bookbuilding and definition of terms for a multi-tranche USD fixed-rate **bond issue**. The issue, offered to qualified institutional investors in the United States pursuant to Rule 144A of the US Securities Act of 1933, and to investors resident outside the United States pursuant to Regulation S under the US Securities act of 1933, is part of Telecom Italia's actions to refinance **debt reaching maturity** and diversify the investor base.

In view of high market demand, the total size of the transaction was set at an aggregate of \$ 3.5 **billion**, split into tranches maturing in five, ten and thirty years.
